






California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation

GRISIS RESPONSE TEAMS (CRT)

CRTs respond to emergency situations inside the institutions as well as working in conjunction with local law enforcement agencies if the need arises. Individuals on these teams receive training with special weapons.

CAMP OFFICERS

Correctional Officers are assigned to each of the 42 Conservation camps located throughout the State. These officers receive specialized training in wildland firefighting and work in cooperation with CAL FIRE and the Los Angeles County Fire Department during emergencies such as fires, floods, and natural disasters.

K-9 HANDLERS

K-9 Handlers complete training along with their K-9s for narcotics detection or contraband detection: such as cell phones and tobacco.

RANGEMASTER

The Post - 9/11 GI Bill is a 36 month tax free education benefit program administered by the Department of Veteran Affairs for individuals who served on active duty after September 10, 2001. Applicants for the classification of Correctional Officer may be eligible to receive the Post - 9/11 GI Bill if they served at least 90 aggregate days on active duty after September 10, 2001. Post - 9/11 GI Bill eligibility is determined by the Department of Veteran Affairs.

WHAT IS THE POST 9/11 GI BILL ENTITLEMENT?

While attending an approved program, applicants who meet all Post - 9/11 GI Bill requirements may receive the basic allowance for housing (BAH) payable at the military E-5 with dependents rate.

EXAMPLES:

 A qualifying Cadet who meets all criteria listed above may receive the following monthly salary:

Academy Pay	\$3,608.00*
9/11 GI Bill Entitlement	\$2,108.00
Total	\$5,7 16.00

 A qualifying entry-level Correctional Officer may receive the following monthly salary:

Entry Level Correctional Officer	\$4,438.00
9/11 GI Bill Entitlement for San Quentin	\$2,936.00
Total	\$7,374.00
